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Information and Guidance	
What kinds of SEND do you provide for?	The range of needs that we plan and provide for fall in to four broad areas: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Communication and interaction • Cognition and learning • Social, emotional and mental health difficulties • Sensory and or physical needs
What is your policy on identifying and assessing SEND needs?	You can read more about how we identify needs and plan to meet them in our SEND policy available on our website from the link: Policies Crookham Church of England Aided Infant School (crookhaminfants.co.uk) Identification starts with a good knowledge of your child, and you can help us build that picture.
How do you assess and review the progress of pupils with SEND?	All children are assessed against their age related expectations across the curriculum. Where children are working below their age related curriculum, we assess and celebrate small steps of progress using criteria appropriate to their age and stage of development.
How do you work with parents?	Our pupils benefit from a strong working partnership between home and school. We therefore regularly consult with you as parents on all aspects of your child's education, including reporting to you on your child's progress towards outcomes, how they learn best, how we plan, teach, assess and review. Sometimes this might be a meeting or a telephone conversation or sometimes a written report.
How are children consulted about their education?	We also involve our pupils as far as possible in their learning journey and regularly 'conference' them about their views. As part of the review cycle for children's individual learning plans and EHCPs we capture and consider the voice of the child.
What is your teaching approach to SEND pupils? Will my child with SEND engage in all school activities?	We tell you more about our teaching approach in our SEND policy available at: Policies Crookham Church of England Aided Infant School (crookhaminfants.co.uk) Our first approach is the same for all pupils – with or without SEND – we adopt a Quality First Teaching approach and get to know them as an individual and a valued member of our school 'Team Crookham'. A key foundation of our teaching approach is to be as inclusive as possible. We are solution-focussed to enable all our pupils to engage in our broad and rich curriculum.
What additional support for learning is available to pupils with SEND?	Within high quality inclusive teaching we provide appropriate scaffolds so that all children can access the curriculum. Where children require additional learning support we may also provide additional interventions in order to enable them to keep up or catch up, or to make progress from their own starting points.
How do you adapt the	We use our best endeavours to make 'reasonable adaptations' based on the individual needs of the child. For example, you

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<p>curriculum and environment?</p>	<p>might see 'visual timetables' on display in our classrooms to support children who find moving from one activity to another particularly challenging or you might see a learning support assistant using Makaton or PECS to communicate with another child. We adopt the use of SEND Smart classrooms to support easy access for SEND for all. We also consider and reflect on our Ordinary Available Provision (OAP) to make sure we provide an inclusive environment and curriculum.</p>
<p>How will equipment and facilities to support children with SEND be secured?</p>	<p>It may be that your child's needs mean that we need to secure extra equipment or facilities, more support staff hours, further training for our staff or external specialist expertise. If funding is needed beyond the necessary costs covered by the school, we will seek funding from the local authority.</p>
<p>Do your staff have expertise with SEND? Does this include SEND pupils who are 'looked after' children?</p>	<p>We have an experienced staff team who over the years have worked with children with a range of SEND. However, each child is different and there are times when we need to invest in continuing professional development and further training to meet a particular need. We have a Designated Teacher for our 'looked after' children who will work closely with our SENDCo to ensure the best provision for these SEND pupils.</p>
<p>How do you support children's social and emotional needs, prevent bullying and prepare them for transition to Junior School?</p>	<p>Our school ethos of 'Team Crookham' promotes the value of love for others. We work hard as a staff to nurture all our pupils and to prepare them well for the next stage of their lives. Our School ELSA (Emotional Literacy Support Assistant) is part of our professional team and can provide specialist support on a range of issues, including preventing bullying. We also work with other agencies to ensure our children have all the pastoral support they need to thrive at our school and beyond!</p>
<p>Do you work with other professionals?</p>	<p>We regularly work with a number of other professional agencies from both the Health and Social Care sectors. Examples of these professionals might include Speech and Language Therapists and Occupational Therapists and the Primary Behaviour Service.</p>
<p>How will I know your provision is effective for my child? What if I want to raise a complaint?</p>	<p>Evaluation of our provision is a core part of our work in education and we implement regular 'plan, do, review' in our school improvement cycle. As well as self-evaluation our provision is regularly subject to review by others including governors, local authority audit teams, Diocesan and Ofsted inspection.</p> <p>We hope that you will feel able to raise all concerns with us whether large or small and our communication summary sheet (mentioned above) will help you know how to do this.
